In the third level the following morphological and syntactical phenomena are presented:
 - Indirect speech
 - Possessiveness (in combination with the inflexion of ל)
 - Expressing the definite direct object and the inflexion of את
 - Ordinal and cardinal numerals in the male and female gender (11-100)
 - The present tense of the following groups and sub-categories:
הפעיל שלמים, פיעל ל"י-ל"ה, פיעל מרובעים
 - The equivalent infinitive forms of the verbs
 - Adjectives
- **Learning outcomes:**
By the end of this course, student will be able to:
 - Read and comprehend longer texts (up to 200 words)
 - Produce written speech of limited extent (about 100 words), mainly descriptions
 - Produce oral speech, mainly descriptions of people, places etc
 - Handle the cardinal numerals from 1 to 100 and do simple calculations (addition and subtraction)
 - Conjugate verbs of the groups and sub-categories that are mentioned during the lesson as well as structure the equivalent infinitive forms
