### ANNOUNCEMENT

Students who are proven to work at least twenty (20) hours per week, students with disabilities, as well as athletes who during their studies belong to sports clubs registered in the register of the General Secretariat of Sports and a) for all the years they occupy 1st to 8th place in pan-Hellenic individual sports championships with the participation of at least twelve (12) athletes and eight (8) clubs or compete in teams of the two higher categories in team sports or participate as members of national teams in pan-European championships, world championships or other international events under the auspices of the Hellenic Olympic Committee, or b) participate at least once, during their studies in the curriculum for which they are applying for part-time status, in Olympic, Paralympic games and Olympic games for the deaf, may, upon application to the Dean of their School, enroll as part-time students.

**The application for inclusion in the part-time status is made at the Secretariat of the Dean of the Faculty of the School of Humanities during the deadline for renewal of semester registrations of the Department of Mediterranean Studies, as defined by a relevant announcement of the relevant Secretariat.**

At the same time with the application, documents are submitted as attached, proving the conditions that are met for the possibility of part-time study.

In Particular:

- a. Students working at least twenty (20) hours per week must present the relevant employment contract or certificate of their employer as well as stamps for insured persons in the private sector.
- b. Students with disabilities must present a certificate of disability from the Disability Certification Centers (KEPA) or from a seven-member health committee of a public hospital. Students who have enrolled in the special category of students with disabilities are not required to provide additional supporting documents apart from those originally submitted for enrollment.
- c. Athletes must submit a certificate from the General Secretariat of Sports, or the Olympic Committee, as the case may be, certifying the reason for applying for part-time study.
