Ontology and semantics of the Egyptian magical system of thought and practice (heka). The socio-political components and configurations of the magical phenomenon in Pharaonic and Greco-Roman Egyp. Sacramental forms and traditions. The mystical phenomenon during Late Antiquity (Neoplatonism, Hermeticism, Gnosticism). The concepts of the soul and human existence in

relation to the divine in the mystery cults of Late Antiquity. The Egyptian mystery religious tradition and its role in the Christian theology. The role of the Alexandrian hermeneutic tradition in the creation of orthodox mystical theology. The philosophical and theological aspects of Jewish mysticism (Kabbalah). Mystical revival, inner counter-enlightenment, empiricism and modernism in the modern era (20th and 21st centuries).
